

MEMORANDUM ORDER

No. <u>42</u> Series of 2021

SUBJECT

GUIDELINES PRESCRIBING THE TRANSFER, SELLING, CULLING EMERGENCY DISPOSAL, AND VALUATION OF ANIMALS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE FARMS IN CONSONANCE WITH PROPERTY, ACCOUNTING, AND AUDITING RULES AND

I. GENERAL PROVISION

1.1 Authority of the Regional Director

REGULATIONS

No animals shall be transferred, loaned-out, dispersed or disposed without written approval of the Director (Authority to Release Animals), or in his/her absence, the Assistant Director/Regional Technical Director concerned.

1.2 Breeder Animals for Clientele

Animals for release as breeders shall be through the existing animal loan program guidelines, with options for outright payment in kind or in cash.

Authority to release animal is given to the Center Chief in case of 10 head and below for swine and 100 head and below for poultry.

1.3 Culling of Ruminants


Cattle, goat and sheep shall be culled based on industry standards or as deemed necessary by the Center Chief/Farm In-charge and approved by the Regional Director or in his/her absence, the Assistant Director/Regional Technical Director concerned, the liveweight per kilogram price of which shall be based on the prevailing market price in the area.

1.4 Culling of Swine and Poultry

Swine and poultry shall be culled based on industry standards or as deemed necessary by the Center Chief/Farm In-charge and approved by the Regional Director or in his/her absence, the Assistant Director/Regional Technical Director concerned,, the liveweight per kilogram price of which shall be based on the prevailing market price in the area.

Authority to release animal is given to the Center Chief if the number is less than 10 for swine and less than 100 for poultry.





1.5 Direct Sale through Bidding

Animals identified for culling may be sold through bidding in accordance with the Procedures on Disposal of Culled Animals.

1.6 Transfer of Breeder Animals to LGU and other Government Institutions

Subject to the approval of the Director, authority shall be given to the Center Chief/Farm In-charge to transfer animals for breeding purposes as per request of LGUs, provinces, municipalities, or other government institutions depending on exigency and availability. The said animals shall be covered by Invoice and Property Acknowledgement Receipt(s) and dropped from the DA's book of accounts.

1.7 Emergency Disposal of Animals

The Center Chief/Farm In-charge shall have the authority to immediately dispose animals that have been seriously injured to prevent unnecessary suffering and to at least recover their salvage value.

Documents for emergency disposal through sale are as follows:


- 1. Incident Report and clinical history signed by a licensed veterinarian stating among others that the animal is recommended for emergency disposal but is otherwise fit for human consumption
- 2. Photo of Animal;
- 3. Property Section Certified True Copy of Property Acknowledgement Receipt (PAR); and
- 4. Photocopy of Official Receipt, to facilitate the animal's dropping from the book of accounts.

1.8 Relief from Livestock Property Accountability

In cases of animal loss through death, the Center Chief/Farm In-charge as accountable officer shall request for COA inspection and verification, and provide the following documents to support request for relief from animal property accountability as follows:

- COA Inspection and Verification Report;
- 2. Necropsy Report signed by a licensed veterinarian
- 3. Livestock Death Certificate;
- 4. Affidavit of Accountable Officer;
- 5. Affidavit of Two Disinterested Persons;
- 6. Certified True Copy of Property Acknowledgement Receipt (PAR); and
- 7. Photograph of the dead animal conspicuously showing the animal identification, i.e., ear tag or tattoo and/or firebrand number.





II. DEFINITION OF TERMS

2.1	Purebred	-	known/identified sire and dam of similar or different breeds registered in the National Ruminant Registry
2.2	Commercial	-	unknown sire, crossbred (50:50)
2.3	Upgrades (goat)	-	native breed cross with other goat breeds
2.4	Native	-	Philippine Native
2.5	Culling	-	removal of animals from the herd/flock for specific reasons, such as but not limited to old-age, infertility, aggressive behavior, unproductivity, physical deformities and genetic defects, diseases, and fam management decisions on change of priority, budget availability, and capacilities, etc.
2.6	Emergency Sale	-	disposal of animals that have been seriously injured to prevent unnecessary suffering and to at least recover their salvage value.

III. SELLING PRICES OF ANIMALS:


The selling price of all livestock (breeder animal/slaughter animal), at DA Farms shall be based on existing liveweight price per kg in the area, duly proven by a report on the conduct of price monitoring in the locality.

For poultry, selling price shall also be based on existing market price in the area, duly proven by a report on the conduct of price monitoring in the locality.

IV. VALUATION OF ANIMALS

All animals at DA Farms shall be valued based on the following tables. These values may be updated on an annual basis through the amendment of the Order, if found necessary and appropriate by the Department.
